## **News State, National & Legislative Update**

#### **Ecology Final Aquatic Mosquito Control General Permit**

May 21, 2024. Ecology issued the Final Aquatic Mosquito Control National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System General Permit. The permit becomes effective on June 20, 2024, and will expire on June 20, 2029. The final permit, Fact Sheet, and Response to Comments are available on our <u>permit webpage</u>. EPA Announces Final Rule to Protect Water Quality Where Tribes have Treaty and Reserved Rights. May 2, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) announced a final rule that will help protect water quality where Tribes hold and assert rights to aquatic and aquatic-dependent resources. For the first time, this action establishes a clear and consistent national framework for EPA and states to consider Tribal treaty and reserved rights when establishing Water Quality Standards under the Clean Water Act. In addition, this rule advances the Biden-Harris Administration's commitment to uphold the United States' treaty and federal trust responsibility to federally recognized Tribes. When implemented, this final rule will better protect waters that Tribes depend on for fishing, gathering wild rice, cultural practices, and other uses.

The final rule will be effective 30 days after publication in the Federal Register. Learn more about EPA's final Tribal Reserved Rights rule.

### Resources

**EPA's "Stormwater Smart" tools are now available in Spanish!** You will find the Spanish versions with their corresponding English version on the webpage, each ready for downloading and customizing. The Stormwater Smart collection includes brochures, infographics, one-pagers, and social media posts to educate the public.

Explaining why it's important to invest in stormwater management to reduce stormwater pollution can be complicated. Many people don't know what the term means, or how their actions can pollute stormwater and affect local waterways. Education is key to helping people understand how they can avoid polluting and protect stormwater as a resource. The Spanish versions will help to reach even larger groups of community residents.

While the tools can help get started on public education and outreach, states will still decide what meets permitting requirements. Developed with coordinated content and artwork, these tools can help in three ways:

- Show what stormwater is and how it can pollute local waterways.
- Promote good stormwater management practices.
- Explain how everyone can value stormwater as a community resource as well as manage it with green infrastructure.

Stormwater Smart tools, in English and Spanish, can be printed or posted on social media, web pages and as hardcopy handouts or posters customized with local contact information. <u>EPA's How-to Manual</u> offers practical suggestions for how and when to use the materials.
